and all CD4 test results**

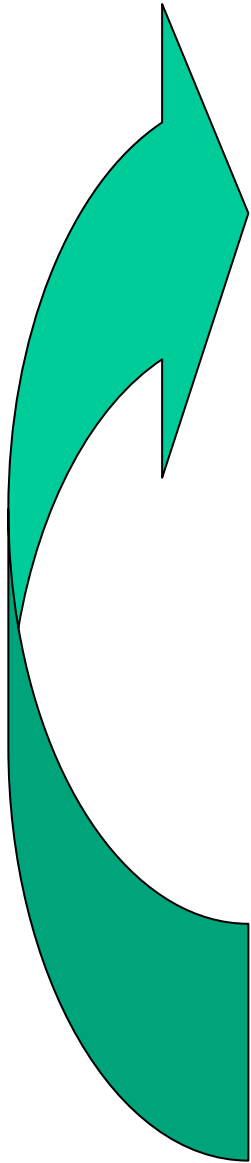
Sends report to the AIDS Administration
