ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION AND
REINSTATING PHARMACIST LICENSE

By Order dated **July 14, 1994**, ("the **1994** Order"), the Maryland Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") accepted the voluntary surrender of **Robert Cailler, P.D.** (the "Respondent") license to practice pharmacy that was imposed by Order of the Board dated September 15, 1993. The 1994 Order of the Board mandated that Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland be **REINSTATED and SUSPENDED**. The **suspension** was stayed and Respondent was placed on probation subject to certain conditions (the "Conditions of Probation").

By letter received **July 18, 1996**, Respondent petitioned the Board for reinstatement of **his** license to practice pharmacy in Maryland without any condition or restriction. At its meeting of **August 14, 1996**, the Board determined the steps for Respondent to follow for his license to be reinstated. Based on its review of that petition and the reports submitted to the Board, the Board determined that Respondent had satisfactorily fulfilled all of the Conditions contained in the **1994** Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds that Respondent has satisfactorily complied with all the Conditions imposed by its 1994 Order.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Board concludes as a matter of law that it is appropriate to terminate Respondent's Conditions on his license and to reinstate **his** pharmacist license without any condition or restriction.

ORDER

UPON THE FOREGOING Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is this 19th day of August, 1996 by unanimous vote of a quorum of the Board

ORDERED that effective as of the date of this Order, the Conditions imposed on Respondent's practice of pharmacy by the Board's 1994 Order are hereby **TERMINATED** and of no force and effect; and be it further

ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Maryland be **REINSTATED** without any condition or restriction whatsoever.
